Dear Cassie,

Travelers United recently gave us a copy of a complaint, filed in court and served on you last year, in certain legal proceedings against you. As the complaint made multiple references to Guinness World Records, we were disappointed that you had not brought it to our attention yourself.

In light of the complaint, we now demand that you immediately cease and desist from making or publishing, in any form and anywhere in the world, any representations concerning your Guinness World Records titles, except representations that, between 24 July 2015 and 2 February 2017, you held the Guinness World Records title for *The fastest time to visit all sovereign countries (female)* and the Guinness World Records title for *The fastest time to visit all sovereign countries*. We consider all other representations you have made, or may wish to make, concerning Guinness World Record titles to be false and misleading, and we reserve our rights against you in that regard. Without limiting our rights, we are unprepared to consider your applications to us in connection with further record attempts unless you have given us a written undertaking to cease and desist, and we are satisfied that you have in fact ceased and desisted, as we have demanded.

We will regard you as having no objections to our disclosing this demand to Travelers United unless you or your attorneys tell me otherwise in writing within 7 days.
